# Introducing Olive Wynacht, Resident



Hi my name is Olive Wynacht! I was born in Maitland, Lunenburg County. I grew up there with my parents, two brothers and two sisters.

We had a mixed farm that had a little bit of everything; horses, ox, cows, pigs, sheep, poultry, etc. I worked on the farm all my life until I was twenty-one. I milked the cows, looked after the hens, fed the animals, kept up with housework, and so much more. We got sap out of maple trees and my mother cooked it down to make maple syrup and sometimes maybe sugar candies. We nursed some of the sheep because, if there were twins, the mother would only look after one, so we'd give the other sheep milk in a dish.

At twenty-one, I went to the Royal Hotel in Mahone Bay and worked there for ten years. I then worked at the Fairview hotel in Bridgewater from 1964 - 1985.

My husband Sidney worked at both of the hotels with me. We got married in 1966. We built our house in 1984. Before building our house, we both lived at the hotel. We didn't have any children.

Together, my husband and I liked to go to the exhibition and we liked to go fishing. We had a simple life but we enjoyed it.
