Education Update:

This year, the education plan will focus on providing all staff training on Person Centred Care.

The program is a model or philosophy of care that recognizes individuals have unique values, personal history and personality and that each person has an equal right to dignity, respect, and to participate fully in their environment.

The education was developed in collaboration between Northwood. Saint Elizabeth Health Care and the Alzheimer's Society of Canada.

This education will begin to address areas identified for improvement in our resident and family survey including staff attentiveness and responsiveness and families need for better communication and involvement.

Point Click Care

Shoreham has implemented an electronic charting system, Point Click Care. The system improves documentation and communication for staff. It also improves privacy and provides access to comprehensive assessment tools and greater accessibility to information for the entire interdisciplinary team.

Plans are to have care plans and daily activities available electronically for CCA staff on the wings by the end of the year.
