Maintenance Update by Gaye Ernst

Employees of RBC are coming on June 16th to paint the gazebo in front of the Home.

We are currently in the process of obtaining quotes for a smoke hutt for staff which will be located behind the current resident's smoke hutt.

May 31st – A "mock" emergency exercise was conducted in conjunction with Northwood for Code Orange, which is reception of residents from another facility. Every three years, Shoreham is required, under the Homes for Special Care Regulations and by our licensing process, to conduct a full scale emergency response exercise that tests plans and procedures we have in place, to respond to an emergency. The exercise conducted on May 31st has fulfilled this requirement. The Emergency Planning Committee is in the process of reviewing the Emergency Plan and will be updating emergency codes so that they are consistent with Northwoods. These will be communicated once the plan has been reviewed.

Safety Tip – with the nice weather upon us we would like to remind Families to ensure that they sign residents out/ in for outings to ensure that staff are aware of where residents are in the event of an emergency.
