Resident Room Project – We are happy to say this project has been completed except for a few deficiencies and the installation of corner guards in the residents' rooms. Thank you to all the staff for packing, unpacking and moving residents. Thank you to residents and families for their patience.

Waste Pipe Project – This project was completed on August 15, 2022. This project included cleaning, inspection, and relining of waste pipes throughout the facility.

Sprinkler Head Replacement – The contractor is tentatively booked to begin this project in mid-October. The scope of work is to replace sprinkler heads throughout the facility. When sprinkler heads are being replaced in resident rooms, we will coordinate with recreation staff to entertain residents during these periods of time.

Ceiling Lifts – Funding has been received to install three new ceiling lift tracks and motors. This project will be scheduled to be completed within the next couple of months.

Commerical Mixers – Two new stand mixers were purchased and installed in the kitchen on the second week of August.

Funding for these projects was received from the Department of Seniors and Long Term Care.

Heat Pump Main Lounge – Installation of a new heat pump was completed on August 25th. Thank you to the Shoreham Village Foundation for funding.

New policy for labelling and minor repairs of resident clothing – As part of this policy, we are implementing a form to be completed by family and/or staff when new clothing is to be labeled or item(s) require repair. Family or next of kin will receive a copy of the completed form and be notified once item(s) have been returned to the resident.

And the results are in: Long-Term Care **Resident and Family Survey Follow Up**

We want to thank the Shoreham residents and family members who completed the Resident and Family Surveys in May/June 2022. The results have been shared and posted in various areas - via email for families, on-site communication boards, and the Shoreham Hub for staff.

Although the results of both surveys were positive overall, there is always room for improvement. Shoreham's Leadership Team has identified key areas for improvement in an action plan. All action items are in progress. The action plan has also been posted to the Shoreham Hub, sent via email, and posted to the Communication Boards.

Here is a summary of the results. Full results as mentioned can be found on the communication boards and the Shoreham Hub for staff.

Shoreham 2022 Resident Survey Results: N size: 29

Overall quality of care was 86.2%. This places Shoreham higher than the Cdn. LTC. Avg. of (83.7%). It also exceeds the internal benchmark of ≥85%.

The likelihood of recommending Shoreham was 78.6%. This places Shoreham higher than the Cdn. LTC. Avg. (77.6%) and below our internal benchmark of \geq 85%.

Shoreham 2022 Family Survey Results: N size: 43

Overall quality of care was 95.2%. This overall guality of care percentage places Shoreham above the Cdn. LTC. Avg. (91.1%). It also exceeds the internal benchmark of \geq 85%.

The likelihood of recommending Shoreham is 90.1%. This places Shoreham significantly higher than the Cdn. LTC. Avg. (58.2%) and higher than the internal benchmark of \geq 85%.
